Mallorca's seabed changed into an underwater gallery for a few days last June. Czech artist Vlastimil Beranek and his team lowered seven heavy Bohemiam crystal sculptures onto the sand and watched how the light changed the colours of the sculptures.

First ever underwater exhibition of crystal sculptures

Vlastimil Beranek's sculptures was organised in Mallorca by newly founded gallery ARTsiO, in collaboration with Crystal Caviar.

Seven heavy glass sculptures, each weighing up to 100 kg, were lowered onto the Mallorcan sculptures tend to be substantial pieces, big and seabed using boat ropes and winches near Punta heavy, and built so that one can have a 360 degree Negra.
